The public generosity that continued towards St. James's Hospital in 2011 is extraordinary. The outcomes of the fundraising events carried out by the Foundation during 2011 all exceeded those of the preceding year, and public donations increased substantially. The Foundation's remit increased in 2010 to encompass processing research grants and employing research staff on behalf of the hospital and this service is now firmly established and delivering a positive contribution on several levels.

Another very positive development during 2011 was the establishment of The Friends of St. James's Hospital. We are deeply grateful to all those who have joined as members of this new group – who have generously committed their financial support and who we welcome as advocates for St. James's.

As a radiologist at St. James's, I have a great interest in the hospital and am most grateful for the opportunity to make a contribution to its development. These are exciting times for the hospital – a major new clinical research centre is currently being built and the construction of the hospital's long-awaited centre of excellence for successful ageing will soon start. What we do

St. James's Hospital Foundation facilitates and attracts private investment in St. James's Hospital; investment to enhance the facilities, education and environment for leading-edge research and innovation, which will translate into world-class care for all patients of this hospital. The Foundation is a limited company and is separate from St. James's Hospital. We fulfil our mandate as follows.

DONATIONS

St. James's Hospital is grateful to received unsolicited donations from former patients and their families and friends – and friends in general of the hospital. The Foundation processes these donations on behalf of the hospital and disburses them. General unsolicited donations received are disbursed within the hospital through a competitive process. Donations dedicated for a specific department or purpose are ring-fenced and disbursed accordingly.

SPECIAL FUNDS

We set up Special Funds on behalf of individuals within the hospital who – and whose patients also – fundraise for their own departments. These Special Funds provide a secure and accountable way for individuals to receive donations given to them for specific purposes.

RESEARCH FUNDS

We set up Research Funds on behalf of individuals within the hospital who have received funds for the purposes of research. In return for a fee, the Foundation facilitates the employment of research staff and the purchasing of vital equipment.

FUNDRAISING

We raise funds for the enhancement of St. James's Hospital. Our work in this regard involves identifying targeted strategic goals and developing suitable fundraising campaigns.

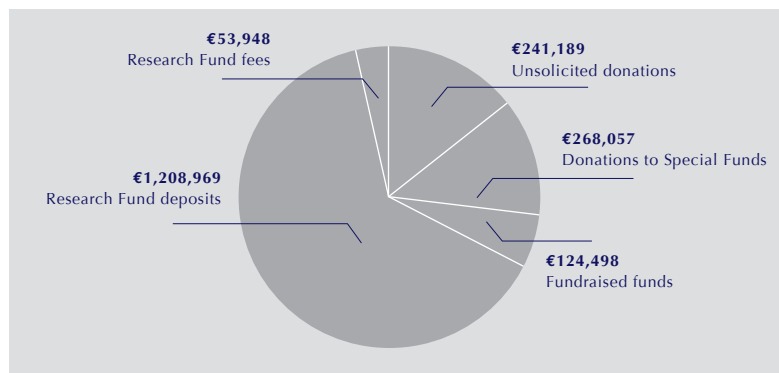
The new work taken on by the Foundation during 2011 – of processing research grants and employing research staff – represents a major opportunity for the Foundation. In its second year this work has generated fee income of €53,948.

All funds raised through Foundation fundraising during 2011 have been reserved to benefit the newly-established heart support service.

In addition to this, the hospital continued to benefit from unsolicited private and corporate donations received from all over Ireland – given for the general benefit of the hospital and also for specialties throughout the hospital.

How the hospital and patients benefited from donations during 2011

€1,643,781 was disbursed in 2011 for the benefit of current and future patients of St. James's. The scale of this report provides for a limited presentation only of how particular areas of the hospital benefited from the generosity of donors. We hope that you will agree that your gifts are well used and more information is available at anytime from the Foundation office.

RESEARCH AT ST. JAMES'S

All medical consultants at St. James's hold academic and research posts in Trinity College and their work constitutes some of the most important medical research being undertaken anywhere in the world. During 2011, the Foundation managed 22 funds for research on behalf of consultant members of staff at St. James's Hospital. €1,308,797 was disbursed from these funds during 2011. These funds were used to invest in research infrastructure and to purchase research consumables and were also used to employ laboratory staff to work within the Institute of Molecular

Medicine and clinical research staff to work alongside departments throughout the hospital; their research has focused, among other diseases, on cancer, HIV/Aids and neurology and rheumatology.

CONTINUING SUPPORT FOR STROKE PATIENTS

During the past year the hospital continued to invest in the stroke service. More education for physiotherapists and physiotherapy equipment has been provided and additional equipment for the clinical nutrition service has also been provided. All investment was made from funds raised specially for the stroke service. Approximately 450 stroke patients present at St. James's Hospital each year and this additional resourcing, together with improved processes and the increased focus of the multi-disciplinary team has resulted in shorter lengths of time for people in hospital and a lower mortality rate of 11% that is in line with the best outcomes in the world.

ADVANCEMENT FOR HEART FAILURE PATIENTS

During the past year there has been a major investment in the service provided to heart

failure patients. Led by a consultant cardiologist, a specialist heart support service, with a team including a cardiology registrar and two specialist nurses – with input and support provided from the Departments of Physiotherapy and Pharmacy – has been established. In January the hospital allocated two clinic rooms from which a specialist outpatient service is now provided. A significant investment has been made in high-specification treatment chairs and computer infrastructure, and major medical equipment will now be provided. All investment has been and will be made from funds raised specially for the heart support service. Heart failure prevalence is increasing faster than any other chronic illness and it is particularly high in the catchment area of St. James's. Approximately 1,500 patients present at St. James's Hospital each year with a primary or secondary diagnosis of heart failure.

MAJOR INVESTMENT IN THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

A major donation received from the medical students of Trinity College was received for the purpose of improving the comfort of the ICU waiting area. The colour and lighting scheme

were improved, a new layout designed and new furniture custom built to provide privacy and increased comfort for several family groups at the same time. Acutely ill patients are taken care of by the ICU and high dependency teams at St. James's Hospital who attend more than 1,000 patients every year.

SPECIAL FOCUS ON CANCER

St. James's Hospital is the largest single provider of cancer treatment in Ireland and the hospital is fortunate to receive significant donations each year from former patients and their families and friends for the improvement of services for patients. To improve the comfort of patients, the Haematology Oncology Day Ward has undertaken a project to upgrade all treatment chairs for patients and the Walter Stevenson Ward has provided adjustable electric beds for all patients; both initiatives will have a lasting impact on patients' comfort. A special donation given for cancer care at St. James's was used to provide 450 reflexology and 48 therapeutic yoga sessions for St. James's patients that attend Arc's cancer support centre on South Circular Road.

NEW EQUIPMENT FOR PATIENT CARE

A range of small equipment that has enhanced care for patients was funded during the year. These ranged from a contribution for scanning equipment for the gynae-oncology service, funding for specialist equipment to assist head and neck cancer patients with mouth exercise, to equipment for the Department of Occupational Therapy to assist their education of elderly patients in preparation for their return home from hospital. A training kitchen that will be used by the Department of Clinical Nutrition to assist in education of Diabetes patients was installed and new software for the Department of Medical Physics was purchased that will enable the department to calibrate the surgical monitors and displays around the hospital for improved accuracy.

IMPROVEMENT OF PATIENTS' EXPERIENCE

As a health-promoting hospital, St. James's aims to utilise the arts in its service to provide creative outlets for patients and promote their well being, and the medical and care staff at St. James's aim to help all patients in a comprehensive way. A small grant was provided

from general donations for the hospital's arts programme that facilitated a series of recitals for patients – these included classical, traditional and jazz performances during November and December. Major investment continued also for mental health patients – seminars to assist patients' wellbeing and recoveries were provided, targeted therapeutic programmes were delivered and activities and excursions of interest were arranged.

ENHANCEMENT OF THE GENERAL ENVIRONMENT FOR PATIENTS

Water coolers were provided for patients at several locations throughout the hospital and a privacy booth was provided from general donations received for the Endoscopy Discharge Area. The family room at Private 3 Ward was comprehensively upgraded during the year as a result of a very generous individual donation given for the purpose; the colour and lighting scheme were upgraded and new, more comforting furnishing provided.

A debt of thanks is owed to all of the donors who have made these investments possible.
